

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, members. I certainly support the amendment. I really don't feel that Senator Marsh is understanding what we are talking about out in our part of the country. We get down to Ogallala where a family goes down there on Saturday, maybe the boy or daughter is working and they come down in a separate automobile. I can see no reason why they should have to pay double price or \$15 if they have three cars, one of them being a pickup that you are taking your boat down in and your wife brings the other car, why you should have to pay double price. This same bill was defeated three years ago because they would not accept this, and if they don't accept this I'll vote against it. I think that it is a very important issue.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. President, members of the body. I think I feel like Senator Schmit I think that we have been through this now I think for the third time on this particular amendment. As Senator Marsh said if you can afford the vehicles in the first place you ought to be able to afford the up-keep of the parks and buy an additional sticker. As I said the other day when we were on LB81, this bill in its pure form only provides only slightly over one million dollars. By the time you take out administrative costs, you take out the printing costs and distribution costs we are talking about \$700,000 to \$750,000 for 92 areas. It is not very much at all it is a beginning, but it is not very much at all. If we go to the multiple sticker type situation, we are cutting that revenue down even more. If you take the time to talk to conservation officers they say that it is not going to be enforceable unless you have the same permit fee because people are going to be buying additional permits and they are going to be lending them out, taping them to windshields and this comes from the conservation officers themselves and I think that they are in a better position to know. I would hope that the body would vote down this particular amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Mills a question or two, because I think that I agree with my Lincoln cohort Senator Marsh from a few telephone calls that I have had. Senator Mills, can you explain to me if I had a camper, I got off work, I went to Branched Oak by myself to start fishing, to set up camp. My wife waits for the kids to get out of school, she comes out in her car. On the back of my camper is one of those little, they are not a putt-putt, but a mini bike. How much would it cost me to get those vehicles in?

SENATOR MILLS: Three times seven and a half dollars.

SENATOR BARNETT: Then I had it figured right. That is the way the bill says today. That is the way the bill is written.

SENATOR MILLS: That is correct.

SENATOR BARNETT: Your amendment will be \$7.50, one and one?

SENATOR MILLS: That is correct, if they are owned by the way
