LB 162, 338, 527, 81
81A, 201, 366, 485

SENATOR SAVAGE: You want to advance the bill now as amended?

SENATOR BARNETT: I sure do. I move to advance LB 162 as amended. What it does is prohibits discrimination in employment because of age. That's the main problem in it. They did ask for the Equal Opportunity Commission to issue interrogatories and you have adopted. They do that through the Attorney General's office. The most important of which removes the mandatory 30 day which you turned down, which we tried to reinstate. I think you've probably acted correctly at this time as far as what Larry Meyers wants. But only he will be able to tell us after he goes through it and visits my office another dozen times. We will now hope that we can advance LB 162 as amended and I promise you I will check on the problem area before it gets to Select.

SENATOR SAVAGE: If there is no discussion, the question is the advancement of LB 162 as amended. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Savage voting aye.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Have you voted? Please vote. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on motion to advance.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The bill is advanced. The schedule I have here goes to Senator Mills on LB 344. Is that correct? The Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, may I read in some material? Senator Duis asked unanimous consent to print an amendment to LB 338. (Refer to pages 1452-1453). Mr. President, Senator Kahle moves to withdraw LB 527. It's to be read in and laid over. Read Select Committee Reports from Enrollment and Review on page 1453 of the Journal. LB 81, 81A, 201, and 366 were correctly engrossed. Signed Senator Cullan, Chairman. Legislative Bill 485. Read LB 485.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I'm sorry Senator Mills, I made a mistake. There are two bills ahead of yours and the Chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen.

CLERK: Read LB 485. There are committee amendments Mr. President. Then there is an amendment to the committee amendment offered by Senator Rasmussen. Read amendment on page 1453 of the Journal.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body. This bill was brought to the Government Committee by Senator Koch. It has been a problem; we have studied this a couple of years. This revises the advisory board to the office of the Fire Marshall and will bring the hearings to the county where the problem is. The committee amendments is the bill. They were brought in the day of the hearing by Senator Koch. After the new amendments were offered, there were no opponents. We offered the Omaha Fire Department nearly a month to come in with some changes and they did not and they said even at that day that they thought they could live with it. I would ask for the adoption of the committee amendments. Then Mr. Clerk I will ask for the adoption for the one on your desk.

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
