PRESIDENT: We were debating the question of the advance of LB 33. For that purpose the Chair now recognizes Senator Swigart. Your light was on before we recessed, Senator Swigart. Could we have some order on the floor please.

SENATOR SWIGART: Mr. Chairman and colleagues, I would like to speak briefly on LB 33. It's my understanding we're off the amendments and now on 33. I wanted to have Senator Koch, when he comes back to the microphone, not on my time at the present time but when he comes back up again if he would answer a couple of questions and one of those is I noticed that certain provisions in the bill call for incentive instruction and transportation and I wondered what portion of this 20 million would offset certain mill levy either in taxes now collected or in taxes proposed for the coming year, what part of it could be attributed to cutting down the mill levy, and number two, what his feelings are with regards to the affect that it would have upon the sales tax and income tax for the coming year. I would like to mention to my colleagues and the President that long last December we were called by a group of educators from the East part of our state, there are some Senators from the eastern part and Senators' elect were called to come out to Waterloo, Nebraska to have a fine dinner and when we were about finished there was a slight upset in our dessert that made it not so delicious when somebody stopped us and says now I wonder if the Senators and Senators' elects wouldn't one by one stand and to advise us how they feel about aid to education. And so when it came my turn I think I made it very clear that, yes I would like to see some errors corrected in the educational problems, particularly those counties and districts throughout the state who have such a terribly high mill levy and need to be adjusted and that I would approve aid to education if it did not raise the sales tax.
