LB 33A, 161, 222

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch, we are still under Call. If I see there's going to be protracted debate, we ought to raise it. Otherwise, I may try to go to a vote.

SENATOR KOCH: The amendment does no more than bring the "A" bill into compliance with the legislation. It was printed incorrectly. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right. We are under Call. The question is, shall LB 33A be advanced? Record your vote.

CLERK: How about this amendment?

PRESIDENT: Oh, excuse me. The question is, the adoption of the amendment, excuse me. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay to adopt the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Now, Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, I move that we advance LB 33A to E & R initial. As amended.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Have you voted? We are under Call. Record. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: We're under call, is that correct?

PRESIDENT: That is correct. Senator Hasebroock voting aye. In all fairness, Senator Koch. Senator Warner, would you approach a microphone. Has the Appropriations Committee met on this matter as to whether or not the 30-vote rule applies?

SENATOR WARNER: Only on final reading.

PRESIDENT: The question that..Senator Savage asked that call be raised. Record your vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised, report the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 17 nays.

PRESIDENT: 33A is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Murphy asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 161 in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Speaker has advised the Chair that there will be no criminal code special order today and that we will spend one hour on Select File and that we'll proceed with LB 224, a bill of Senator Savage, before we commence on the rest of the Select File matters and we'll stay on Select File for one hour.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 238 was returned to Select File for a specific amendment offered by Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, this bill was returned for a specific amendment to separate the residential from commercial property for the purpose of assessment and this was as a courtesy to Senator Brennan, who
