LB 110, 510

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced. LB 257

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Rasmussen asked to lay over LB 257.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered. LB 510.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 510, there are no E & R amendments. There is an amendment offered by Senator Murphy that was offered a series of times and it has been laid over. The amendment is found on page 1137. This is your amendment to amend LB 510. Read.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. Clerk, I believe there is a subsequent amendment to replace that. That is the intent of the amendment and the subsequent amendment that has been redrafted in concurrence with Senator Kremer does substantially the same thing and I would move the substitution. I would withdraw the first amendment and substitute the second one.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Murphy asks to withdraw his amendment found on page 1137.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, there is an amendment offered by Senator Kremer found on page 1416 of the Legislative Journal reading as follows: Read.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I move the adoption of the amendment. What the amendment does, Senator Murphy came to me and he had a little trouble accepting LB 510 on page 14 in section 5, whereby, language was stricken that said this, "for the purpose of this act". In other words, it had to do with the expenditures of funds that were available. What the amendment that I am now offering does exactly what we would have accomplished in the bill only it takes a different route, and the amendment in turn strikes section 5 that Senator Murphy was questioning. It strikes this section and then goes on to provide that chapter 2, section 15-29 and chapter 2 of 15-47 remain intact. If we strike section 5, it would have taken these two sections out and make reference to a language that is already in the statutes and it does provide for the expenditure of funds that become available, either federal, state or local. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is the adoption of Senator Kremer's amendment to LB 510. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays. There are no further amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 510 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

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
