

CLERK: Your motion to introduce a bill dealing with parole pardons.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that the bill be introduced. This is one of the areas that is involved with the intent legislation that the Appropriations Committee considered a variety of requests dealt with the Board of Pardons and the Board of Parole current statute requires that all agencies to have rules and regulations which are published, adopted to be followed. This law was adopted some years ago but there was within the statutes exceptions for these two agencies and it appeared that it would be desirable if they did have rules and regulations and so all that the proposed bill does is bring those two agencies under the requirement of the administrative procedures act as other agencies it may be, well if the bill is introduced it may be appropriate that it would have a hearing in addition to...rather than just be put on General File however.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion?

CLERK: 869.

PRESIDENT: The question is Senator Warner's Request 869 for the introduction of a bill. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Request is granted.

CLERK: Mr. President a new bill LB536, read the bill.

PRESIDENT: Now we go to Final Reading. All Senators please return to your desks. All non-senatorial personnel please leave the floor. All Senators please return to your desks. Please return to your desks so that we can commence Final Reading. Alright Mr. Clerk, LB30.

CLERK: Mr. President a motion pending on LB30. I move to return LB30 to Select File for a specific amendment. Signed, Senator Koch. This motion was considered April 18th and laid over.

SENATOR KOCH: Will the Clerk please read the amendment?

CLERK: The whole thing?

SENATOR KOCH: It is just three lines I believe.

CLERK: No, the amendment is nine pages. Do you just want the new matter read?
