PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Chambers, what you've done is you've complicated the issue once again with this and with your arguments. I guess what we better start doing is checking this through a little bit. I think you may have some good points on it but it was so fast, I was working on something else. Would this have to do...this would not ban anybody from having receivers, correct? I'm asking you questions.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I have to declare unreadiness on this question. I'm not prepared to answer that at this point.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Luedtke. I'm asking questions. This is his last amendment. I'm trying to figure out what the heck it's doing. I have to find out, Senator Luedtke... in this case, let me ask you a question. Then you can address it to that fact. Is really what this amendment does by striking everything, would this allow the deputy sheriffs like we have in Omaha or throughout the state, if we strike these sections would it allow them to intercede on police broadcasts or will it just then make it a crime for them to do it? I think what he's doing is eliminating the fact that they are exempt from this law.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: That's right; that's correct. This would allow them to be...the provisions that he is taking out allows these people, peace officers, those who getting writing from the law enforcement agencies, legal newspapers, etc., to not be covered by that law at all. In answer to it, Senator Chambers says he has developed a...on two horns of a dilemma here but the point is there is still, Senator Chambers I will submit to you and in answer to you Senator Barnett, that they can still get them for aiding and abetting and that sort of thing or even accessory. I think you can...there are ways of getting them Senator Chambers anyway even if this law remains as is. I really think they can. I know what Senator Chambers is trying to accomplish. He'd be taking these people out completely so you wouldn't have any specific people named to be exempt.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'd still like to ask another question. Maybe Senator Chambers would be ready for this one. Would you try to be ready for this one? If not, I'm going to go back down to Luedtke.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll attempt it Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Strictly in the section of police radio sets, now on our CBs that are included, they have a channel 9 which is the emergency channel which does include police departments. Will this in anyway affect that operation?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Barnett, in all seriousness, the only thing that I'm dealing with is the provision which prohibits you from doing things that interfere with police operations. I'm saying that in line with the attitude of the Legislature
