

SENATOR BARNETT: I think you...the (2) refers up to here. It doesn't refer down to here.

SENATOR MARESH: Presently, it refers to all those other violations and this way it would apply only to personal and monetary gain for reporters.

SENATOR BARNETT: I don't think that would do what he wants to do. You are just saying that a police officer, what monetary gain would they have and this is exempting police officers. In (3) (a)...see I don't think it does...it would for (3) (c) but it wouldn't hold true for (3) (a). Do you see what I'm saying?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes.

SENATOR BARNETT: It wouldn't hold true for (3) (a) or (3) (b). I think if you want to amend his amendment, what you might do is make it (3) (c).

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, could you clear this matter up?

SENATOR DECAMP: Maybe by asking a question. Senator Chambers would you answer a question? Just between thee and me, are you after the special deputies here? Is that what's involved?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No.

SENATOR DECAMP: Because they would be the ones that would be appear to be most logically could abuse this and maybe...do you see what I'm saying?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But here, Senator DeCamp, let me try to put in focus again what we are dealing with here. I am not adding anything to the law. The law right now by this part that I am striking, the law right now says that this category of people can interfere for the purpose of stopping the...if a special deputy would interfere to stop the agency from carrying out its duties, he should be liable. If he interferes for the purpose of helping somebody escape, he should be liable. But this provision says, not so. They can do these things and they are not liable criminally. Now if that's what the Legislature wants, reject the amendment and I won't feel badly about it at all. I'll applaud you for your radicalism.

SENATOR DECAMP: I think you should reject the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Chambers amendment number 15. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 11 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, I regret to advise I have no further amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I would move for the advancement of LB 38 to E & R Initial. I don't believe it needs too much more debate.
