SENATOR SAVAGE: Don't you have a present?

PRESIDENT: She put the House under Call. Then she withdrew that and Senator DeCamp has the right to put the House under Call. I am sorry but that is the way it goes. Everybody has their rights and he has the right to put it under Call.

SENATOR SAVAGE: She did ask for your vote before he...

PRESIDENT: She may have asked for it but I did not vote. I don't have to vote. I want to, very desperately but I also want everybody to record their presence desperately. Would the Sergeant at Arms find the other Senators who aren't here. We need Senator Hasebroock and Senator Newell. Senator Hasebroock is the only one. Senator Labeledz. Senator Chambers, do you ask for recognition.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just a point of clarification, Mr. Chairman. Did you say Senator DeCamp was a legend in his own time? Did you mean to say myth?

PRESIDENT: No, I didn't mean that, Senator Chambers. He gets a shot at you now.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I feel like today that Ernie not only looks like Sampson, he uses the same weapons.

PRESIDENT: All right, commence the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz amendment to John DeCamp's amendment.

CLERK: Roll call vote continued. (See page 1542, Journal.)

PRESIDENT: We must have less volume on the floor to hear these.

CLERK: Roll call vote continued. 22 ayes, 21 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment passes. Senator Cullan moves that the Call be raised. Record your vote. Record.
