LB 538, 530

PRESIDENT: Has everyone voted? Has everyone voted? Record. Senator Warner asks that the House go under Call. Record your vote on that matter. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call. All Senators please return to your desks and record your presence.

CLERK: Senator Simon voting no. Senator Fowler voting aye. Senator Rumery voting aye. Senator Merz voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner now moves that the Call be raised. Clear the Board. Record your vote on that. Record.

CLERK: 20 ayes. 1 nay to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 9 nays on the motion to introduce the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion is granted. The bill shall be introduced, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Now the new bill, Mr. President, LB 538 introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by the members thereof. Read title. That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We go to LB 530, apparently.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 530 was considered yesterday at which time the committee amendments were adopted. The next amendment up is an amendment offered by Senator Richard Lewis which is printed in the Journal on page 1484. To that amendment, a Bereuter amendment has been adopted. There is now pending, as amended, the Richard Lewis amendments found on page 1484.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I am willing and ready to close on this amendment but Senator Mills says he has an amendment up there.

CLERK: My apologies. There is a Mills amendment to amend the Lewis amendment. Read. (See page 1544, Journal.)

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Mills.
