LB 483, 486

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt.

SENATOR MARVEL: The motion is carried, the amendment is adopted. Are there any other amendments?

CLERK: None.

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Cullan, 483. Do we have E & R amendments that need to be adopted?

CLERK: Well they all have been Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: Okay, do you want to move 483 to E & R for Engrossment?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB483 as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

SENATOR MARVEL: Is there a second? All those in favor say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. Bill is advanced. Do you want to start on 486?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President 486, I don't but somebody might.

SENATOR MARVEL: Are there amendments to 486?

CLERK: Mr. President the E and R amendments have been adopted. They were adopted on March 30th, and since then there has been some action. The Koch amendment was adopted. There is now a new Koch amendment Mr. President. The bill was advanced on April 18th, and then it was returned to Select File for a previous amendment which is now pending.

SENATOR MARVEL: Is this the Koch amendment? Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body. We discussed these amendments the other day and Senator Lamb had some concern about the meaning and I understand that Senator Lamb no longer has a concern. He was the one that asked that the bill be laid over. As I said before it is a series of three amendments that have been agreed to by the Department of Education who supervisors of proprietary schools along with the Nebraska Council of Private Schools. It has to do with accreditation. We also, the accreditation aspect of if the proprietary school is accredited by HEW then that accreditation will establish the standards and in many cases these may be more stringent than in Section 10 of the law and Section 3 as well. In addition to this we do have some of these schools who grant degrees. Until this law and these rules and regulations are promulgated and put into effect it would allow those schools to continue to grant those degrees because they have classes that graduate on a quarterly basis. I ask for the adoption of these three amendments.

SENATOR MARVEL: Is there a second to the motion? All those in favor of adopting the Koch amendments to LB486 vote aye, those opposed vote no.
