

lation of the publication. Consequently, I want to keep it in line with the other statutes.

PRESIDENT: Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I have to oppose the Duis amendment. The experience has shown that a lot of property owners ... they don't read that newspaper, and that a lot of property owners also may even live outstate, they may live several hundred miles away. There is just absolutely no way to inform those property owners by simply putting a publication in the local newspaper. I have nothing against the publication in the local newspaper, that is fine. But experience on the City Council level has shown that the property owners simply are not notified only by the publication in the local newspaper. We have to add a notification by certified mail so that we are sure that the property owner is informed. There is just no other way of doing it. I, therefore, have to oppose the Duis amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis, would you close debate on your motion to return.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, Mr. President. This was my amendment which I put on there and I wish to have my amendment taken off. I sincerely feel as though the law has functioned well in all cases of publication. I realize I should not change it to certified mail. I ask you to return it so that it is like the rest of the statutes and does it by publication. At another time this might be well, but we'd have to start with a great number of statutes. Consequently, I'd like to have the amendment, which I put on, taken off.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the bill be returned for the specific amendment. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Would you kindly vote on this proposition. Record. Senator Duis. Record the vote. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I dislike doing this, but there are 24 not voting. I would appreciate a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the House go under Call. Record your vote on that. Please vote on this proposition. We'll not make much progress if people won't vote. Record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call, Senator Rasmussen and others. Please return to your desks and record your presence. Please record your presence. Senator DeCamp, we're under Call. Do you want to vote? Senator Carsten voting aye, Mr. Clerk. Senator Rasmussen voting aye.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp voting aye. Senator Savage voting aye. Senator Kremer voting aye. Senator Hasebroock voting aye. Senator Newell voting aye. Senator Reutzel voting aye. Senator Rumery voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Report the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 9 nays.
