PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan the Chair certainly would entertain another motion to lay it over another day if you are not ready on that day.

SENATOR CULLAN: Lay it over until Thursday.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Is there an objection? Seeing none it is so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, a notice of committee hearing. The Constitution Revision and Recreation gives notice of a hearing set for LR 63 for May 3. Senator Carsten and Hefner offer Resolution 65 commending Senator Jules Burbach, that will be read and laid over.

Mr. President, Senator Swigart asks to be excused Wednesday after lunch. Until after lunch, that is right.

Mr. President, Senator DeCamp asks unanimous consent to unbracket 159 and replace...put it back in its original position on General File, signed, Senator DeCamp.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Alright, now Mr. President, I guess that is all we have. We are ready for General File.

PRESIDENT: Alright, General File. LB192.

CLERK: LB192 is introduced by Senator Burrows. Read.

Senator Nichol asks to be excused on Friday.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Mr. Chairman, members of the body. I would like to take up these amendments. These are ones that the staff thought were technical amendments to the bill to correct wording in the bill. We have four parts, I might remind the members that they refer to page 1546 of the Legislative Journal for copies of these amendments. The first amendment on page 6, strikes all of the original section six and inserts the new language, notwithstanding any other provisions of law after the effective date of this act on or before August 1, 1978 and on or before August 1st every year thereafter. The Board of Education of each school district shall report in writing to the Department of Revenue the entire revenue raise by taxation and all other sources and receive by such Board of Education for the previous fiscal year and a budget for the ensuing fiscal year. I would move for the adoption of this amendment. This amendment takes away some old language that refers to the county board and I think that it leaves it clear and more conscise what we are trying to do with the bill and it is actually a clean up of the bills language.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: (no response).

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the adoption

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
