CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nichol.... There is an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator William Nichol which will be inserted in the Legislative Journal (regarding LB 121). That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We go to Final Reading. Would all senators.... Senator Barnett, why do you arise?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I have an announcement before we get started. I passed out, just before we adjourned yesterday, an announcement about a seminar on court organization and the administration of justice. I want all the Legislators in here to know this will be held out at the Kellogg Center. It involves about nine states in the Midwestern area. It's put on by the National Conference of State Legislators. It's the 5th and 6th of May, which is next Thursday and Friday. I passed this information out to you. On two days, like May 5th, they'll be talking about special problems of juvenile delinquency and determinant sentencing, which we're visiting about now in the Criminal Code...on that day if you'd like to attend those seminars. May 6th they're going to talk about court organization and selection retention and discipline of judicial personnel. So those two days we'll have a conference at the Kellogg Center here in Lincoln, 33rd and Holdrege. All of you are invited to attend whenever you can. It will be for the Midwest Region.

PRESIDENT: Thank you Senator Barnett. We now go to Final Reading. All senators please return to your desks. Commence Final Reading. LB 485.

CLERK: Read title to LB 485.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 485 pass. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: Read record vote found on page 1721 of the Journal. 39 ayes, 0 nays, 10 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 485 passes.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are two Legislative Resolutions. LR 68, introduced by the Appropriations Committee, calling for an interim study, which will be referred to the Executive Board. It's directing the Appropriations Committee to make a study.

PRESIDENT: That completes Final Reading.

CLERK: Then there is LR 69 in honor of Dr. Samuel Mudd, a doctor in southern Maryland. (Read title).

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I guess it is about time we take stock of where we are and be realistic about what the windup is going to look like. I now have almost all the preferred bills. I have all the committee bills that are going to have preferred bills, and I have almost all of your individual preferred bills. How far we'll go with them will depend upon what we do between now and the day for adjournment sine die. I just remind you
