SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body. It is obvious that we are dealing with the topic of life either taking or giving. If we are so concerned about the number of abortions that the University Regents shall keep tabs of at the University Hospital, by the same token I think that we should also keep tab of this type of operation because I am almost certain that the number of this types of operations that are being administered at that institution may be equal to that of the subject that we are now discussing at the present time. I think that if we are going to get the issue we might as well make certain that we have accurate records on all of it. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Venditte has called for the previous question. I see five seconds. The question is shall debate now cease. Record your vote. Have you voted? Please vote. There is a vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 7 nays.

PRESIDENT: Debate ceases. The question, sir. The question then is the Koch amendment to the Labeledz amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.
