PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the adoption of Senator Bereuter's amendment to LB 520A. Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: It is adopted. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move that LB 520A, as amended, be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Discussion. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move that LB 537 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Do you have anything on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move that LB 521 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move the E & R amendments to LB 522 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The E & R amendments are adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have a series of amendments, Mr. President. Mr. President, the first amendment is offered by Senator Warner as follows, it's found on page 1743 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Will you take it, Senator Bereuter? Yes.

CLERK: Read amendment.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This is the deficit appropriation bill. Despite having two senators from the Kearney area, they can't keep their boilers under control. One of them blew up and they need immediate repair on the boiler. We're proposing to add \$50,000 for boiler replacement at the Youth Development Center in Kearney. I move for the adoption of the amendment to LB 522.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion? It is Senator Warner's amendment. It is the boiler amendment, Senator Bereuter? Alright. Record your vote. Wait. Senator Schmit, did you want to be recognized?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, Mr. President. This is one of those slow mornings. I'd like to ask Senator Bereuter a question. We're sliding \$50,000 in here pretty easy. I'd like to have a little more of an explanation than that boiler amendment.

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
