

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. It is very normal, in the coverage of insurance for a boiler, that the insurance pays for the damage of the rupture. But it does not pay for the rupture. In other words, boiler insurance covers everything except the boiler. Please note, boiler insurance covers everything regarding that rupture except the boiler. That is not covered in the insurance policy. We will be talking, in the very near future, about LB 309, and this will be beneficial to future problems as this. I thank you.

PRESIDENT: Alright. The question then is the adoption of Senator Warner's amendment. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt. Now, Mr. President, the next amendment offered is Senator Bereuter's. Read Bereuter amendment found on page 1776 of the Journal.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I think that probably other members of the Appropriations Committee will wish to speak on this as well. What it does is not change any dollar amounts, it just changes the funding source for capital construction. We have a very low balance anticipated in the cigarette tax fund. What we're proposing to do here is fund more of this capital construction out of revenue sharing for this year. It still keeps us under the problems pointed out by the Governor, but it does ensure that the revenue sharing money is spent on the larger projects. Since there are certain amounts of red tape connected with revenue sharing, it is best for us to concentrate these funds on large projects. That is basically what we are doing, replacing expenditure proposed for cigarette tax funds with money from the revenue sharing funds on LB 522 which, of course, is the deficit appropriation bill. I move for the adoption of this amendment in behalf of the committee.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the adoption of this amendment by Senator Bereuter. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on motion to adopt. Senator Luedtke's follows. Read Luedtke amendment found on page 1776 of the Journal.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This is a difference of \$16,000, if your quick computer mind hasn't looked at it yet. That is the amount, \$16,000. How it comes about is it's in the budget with regard to the county court system, with regard to holding instructions for the probate code, for the library, and that sort of thing, all of which was in last years budget, all of which was approved by this Legislature, and then was eliminated by line-item veto by the Governor. It is interesting to note that Jim Dunlevey, under date of January 25th of this year, sent to the Governor a letter explaining the continuing need for these items, particularly the increased inflation which, for example, with all the economies they tried to put in materials per volume publication cost increase of \$5,000 for the Supreme Court Reports, which had to be absorbed by the Office of the Courts. This particular thing with inflation just cannot go on. They couldn't carry on all the instructions to the courts, and to the
