That is provided on a basis of the first so many thousand dollars of assessed valuation. But you've repeatedly rejected those proposals. I just want to remind the body, that for those senators that think they got ripped off yesterday, that the urban area got a crumb, it was truly a crumb. I kind of wish that they wouldn't have gotten it because now it allows a number of urban senators to vote for this bad piece of legislation. I will not be one of them, however, unless some of these amendments that I am proposing are put on the bill. I don't have too great a hope that any of those amendments will be put on the bill, but I think it's beneficial for this body to know when it's doing something wrong that some people care and some people are concerned. Just because something is greased, it doesn't make it alright. Thank you. I would hope you would adopt this amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Newell's amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? The question is the adoption of Senator Newell's amendment to LB 513. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 17 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Goodrich. It's found on page 1826 of the Legislative Journal. To that amendment there is an amendment. (Read second Goodrich amendment found on page 1859 of the Journal).

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body. I would move for the adoption of the amendment to the amendment first. There is a typo error in line 13 of the amendment. On page 1826 of the Journal all we're doing, if you're referring to page 1826, after the word "the" we're putting in the word "first", so it will read "payment the first \$45 of the actual tax owed". I would move for the adoption of that amendment first.

CLERK: Mr. President, this....

PRESIDENT: Alright. I have two lights on here, but...I have one light on. Did you want to talk on the amendment to the amendment, Senator Dworak? The amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR DWORAK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Alright.

SENATOR DWORAK: Just one question of Mr. Goodrich. If this is a typographical error, isn't this picked up by E & R? Do we need an amendment if it's a typographical error, or would it be a normal E & R process?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I don't know, to tell you the truth. I was up and looked at the amendment that is laying on the Clerk's desk. It is written correctly, but somehow during the process of sending that to the printer the word "first" got deleted, so I thought in order to eliminate any question about it I would just move for the adoption of this amendment. That way there is no question about the word "first" being in there.
