SENATOR STONEY: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I erred this morning, I would like to make that point perfectly clear. What I attempted to do when I amended Senator Chambers amendment was to provide that those bill that had been bracketed would remain in their established order on the original priority list. The amendment that I offered however did totally the reverse and removed those four bracketed bills from the priority list. I'm not so concerned that my bill LB 114 was one of those particular bills. But, I am concerned that the action that was taken in adopting my amendment may be detrimental to others. So, at this time I would ask you that you please help me in reconsidering the action which was taken just before the lunch hour because I certainly did error and I would certainly not wish to have it on my conscience for actually endangering someone else's bill when that was not the intention that I had in offering the amendment. So, I would ask that you please conscientiously consider this and I know that us being an honest and a body with a great deal of integrity you will certainly help me in returning this amendment so that I might strike that terrible amendment that I offered. Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator F. Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: (no response).

SENATOR MILLS: (no response).

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Lewis, did you wish...Senator Lewis is on and then Senator Mills.
