LB 46

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Murphy does? Alright, so ordered. Now the practical effect, as I understand it, of this will be that the priority bills on General File will read precisely as you have had them put on your desk beginning with LB 46, 114 and so on. The bracketed bills will have no effect as they were indicated on their because of the Stoney amendment. So, that would mean that we will just simply go down the list. The only exception being, as I understand it, Senator Goodrich's LB 89 is not out of committee now, so we couldn't get to that one. But, the order would be by the dates they hit General File which is shown to the right of the name. Is that understood by everyone now?

CLERK: I have nothing further.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Alright we will the proceed pursuant to the Bereuter motion to General File to take up the individual preferred bills on priority beginning then with LB 46.

CLERK: Read LB 46.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: On page 1535 of the Journal gentlemen is a recommendation. I would like to strike Section one of the bill and insert the Attorney General's recommended wording. I accede to the proposition that there are those who have concern with the wording as it presently exists. Accordingly I will accept the drafting as recommended by the Attorney General. I take several exceptions to it, but it is apparent that the influence is such that the best thing that I can do is compromise. It will give some relief, I think, hopefully and accordingly I would ask that Section one be stricken and the proposed draft as recommended by the Attorney General and in your Journal book be inserted. I move the adoption of that amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Alright, speaking to the...is it an amendment? Alright, it is the Murphy amendment. The Chair recognizes first Senator Cullan and then Senator Carsten. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: (no response).

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: He doesn't? Alright, Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I just want to ask Senator Murphy if this is the same amendment that is now being passed out or if this is a different one.

SENATOR MURPHY: It is the same that is being passed out. I just simply make reference to the Journal page indicating the Attorney General's recommendation for that language.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature. What Senator Murphy offered is a statement as to how this amendment, in his opinion, came about. But, he has not
