LB 532

SENATOR BARNETT: Okay. Then, Senator Marsh, would you continue on an explanation of this a little deeper than what Senator Warner did. I am not particularly excited about it and I wish you could try to convince me a little more. What would be the continuation budget for this program and would it be part of the curriculum then, part of the rehabilitation services then and are there job openings, are there places that these people can...you want to tell more about this?

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, sir, there are. This is a field where some of the national truck firms are looking for trained women drivers, that there is this type of opening which would be available when persons are duly qualified rather than a low paying job. If a person wishes to train for a higher paying job, there would be many advantages upon leaving an institution.

SENATOR BARNETT: That is all for now.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Nichol, did you wish further recognition? Senator Warner, any closing then?

SENATOR WARNER: Not unless there is additional questions, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The question then is the adoption of the Warner amendment to LB 532. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? This is on the Warner amendment to LB 532. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Warner amendment is adopted. Next amendment.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, the next amendment is offered again by the Appropriations Committee. It is found also on page 1744 I think identified as (2).

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the balance of these amendments do not add any funds. They are either clarificational language to properly identify a program expenditure or it is verbage or in a couple of cases adjustment in personal services, that is, personal services changed between programs. The first amendment on the bottom of page 1744 is corrective language. Those of you who have been here for awhile will recall there has been appropriations for a number of years dealing with law enforcement and Indian Affairs from the general fund a portion of which is for alcohol rehabilitation but also it is for some law enforcement and jail operations in a couple of counties up in the northeast part of the state and the language that is included here is language the same as it is in the enabling legislation but it clarifies without question the basis on which the money is to be distributed. The next new language is underlined at the top of page 1745. I will refer to Senator Bereuter to respond. It deals with the Crime Commission.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Bereuter.
