

SPEAKER LUEDTKE PRESIDING

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Yes, I took that from General File and offer it for Select File. That is the reason it was withdrawn and reoffered. What it has to do is a piece of legislation that this body passed recently that had to do with the increase of per diem of the Game Commission of the State of Nebraska. So in order to meet the legislation which we authorized, the amount of \$6,300 is the amount anticipated that the cost will be and that is why I have offered this amendment at this time. I ask for the adoption of the amendment to meet the authorization of the legislation passed by this body a couple of weeks ago.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Just in way of explanation, what the committee did, Senator Koch is correct. It reflects the passage of the act that increased the per diem of the members of the Game Commission. The action the committee took was to increase the personal services limitations so that they could pay that additional cost out of existing revenue. Senator Koch's amendment, as he has stated, would increase the general fund appropriation by what, \$1300 or so, to reflect the proportionate share that comes from general fund money to provide funds for that increase in per diem.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any further discussion? Senator Koch, do you wish to close?

SENATOR KOCH: Except that I have the Chair of the Appropriations Committee behind me this time, I think it needs no further ammunition and I move for the adoption.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, the question is the adoption of the Koch amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, we haven't had a Call of the House all day.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: No, we haven't.

SENATOR KOCH: I think we are due for one. We wouldn't want to do anything to our record.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We wouldn't want to go a whole day without a Call of the House.

SENATOR KOCH: That is right. I ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The question is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 6 nays.
