SENATOR BARNETT: I'd move for the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 39.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 39. Any discussion? All those in favor of adopting the E & R amendments to LB 39 say aye. Opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted. Senator Barnett.

So we went to the Attorney General, we went to the Tax Commissioner representing the Governor, we went to the Bill Drafter, they all worked together.
