PRESIDENT: Senator Simon, could you advise Senator Clark about 202.

SENATOR SIMON: Senator Clark, it's on the priority list. I just felt that since we have some other things that are important I didn't want to waste the time of the body, and just wanted to move to bracket till next year.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes, that's fine except you put a date certain. Every bill up there can have a date certain, if you want to bracket a bill to a date certain.

SENATOR SIMON: Senator Clark, Senator Duís did the same thing this morning. I didn't hear you object to him.

PRESIDENT: Will you object?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes, I'll object.

PRESIDENT: Okay.

SENATOR SIMON: I would then move that we bracket it to a date...I think it's the 10th.

PRESIDENT: Alright, 10th of January. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 15 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. What do you have next?

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 109 will be referred to the Executive Board.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker, what are we doing about 518 that we put off till 1:30?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Rasmussen. It's found on page 1985 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dennis Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body. This is LB 315, the bill that was introduced for the Nebraska veterans. It concerns the half a million dollars that was retroactively paid to the Soldier and Sailors Home at Grand Island. This money the bill called for, and so would the amendment, to have it put in a building fund to be used by the veterans when they proceed with their expansion program here in Eastern Nebraska. There is also one other note. Federal monies match this money two to one. So, in essence, for the \$500,000 we would end up with \$1½ million in the veterans building fund. I would ask for your adoption of the amendment. I realize that it is considerable money, but it would be placed in the fund, like I say, until it is needed. Also we would receive back \$1 million from the federal government. I ask for your support in the adoption of this amendment.
