

SENATOR BARNETT: Every two years, and it would, as it says down below, this will be valid for a period commencing with each regular session of the Legislature held in an odd numbered year and shall terminate at the convening of the regular session in the next odd numbered year. So it would go from January to January over a two year span.

SENATOR DWORAK: Okay, thank you, Senator Barnett. I feel that this really isn't going to solve our problem. I think, rather than adopt this original form, we've done more good with the amended LB 4, the shape that it is in right now. I think the DeCamp amendments would have put it in a lot better shape but this body, in its wisdom, thought differently. I think the thing to do is to defeat Senator Barnett's amendment, keep LB 4 in its present form and pass it across.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, I move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: Do I see five seconds? I do. The question is, shall debate now cease? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to close, Senator Barnett?

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, just a short closing to tell everybody they have got an opportunity to get out of a situation that is not pleasant, probably won't pass and the Clerk has told me that he sure would like to have the bill as it was originally drafted and I think the conversation between Senator Dworak and myself cleared that up as to what the bill really does. If there are problems with the lobbying aspects, the registering of attorneys and everything that they speak of, they ought to bring that in and clear it up with a piece of legislation next session which would give them plenty of time to operate in but take this bill back to its original bill for our dear beloved honorable Clerk as he wanted it before all this started. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 14 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. Now the bill has been returned, Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I would move for the adoption of my amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, that is the question, the adoption of the amendment. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Please vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 13 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I would move that LB 4 be advanced as amended.
