SENATOR SAVAGE: Read the amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Savage has a reasonable request that the amendment be read. This is the question to return but you want to know what the amendment is? This is on the motion to return. You want to know for what? All right. Everybody, Senator Marvel.

CLERK: The amendment is as follows, Mr. President. To return LB 533 for a specific amendment to strike the Savage amendment and insert the following: The amendment I am going to read is found on page 2085 of the Legislative Journal. Read. Signed Senator Carsten.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Simon, will you register your presence and Labeledz. Senator DeCamp. All right. We have one more because there are only three absent now. Senator Newell, is he here. Senator Newell. He is the only one I guess. Does anybody know where Senator Newell is? Where. Senator Carsten, are you ready to commence the roll. All right, commence the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 2125, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Let's have some order so that the Clerk can hear. We cannot hear up here.

CLERK: Roll call vote continued.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion by Senator Reutzel to raise the Call. All those in favor of raising the Call vote aye, opposed nay.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 26 nays on the original motion.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, the motion fails. Clear the Board and we are voting on raising the Call. All in favor of raising the Call vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 3 nays.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Call is raised. Any other amendments.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 532, Senator DeCamp has a motion to return to Select File for a specific amendment. Read amendment. (See page 2126, Legislative Journal) Signed Senator Schmit and DeCamp.
