CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bereuter asked to suspend the rules and add his name to LB 44 as the co-introducer. The reason for the suspension of the rule is that he has got his 10 bills in.

PRESIDENT: Senator Bereuter.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. LB 44, which is Senator Koch's bill, is identical in its provisions to a part of a bill that I introduced. My bill was killed by committee with the thought that one bill would be sufficient. I would like to have my name, therefore, added to Senator Koch's bill and it is with his permission. It is necessary, therefore, for me to have a suspension of the rules and I request that of the body.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Senator Bereuter, I'd like to ask a couple of questions. Senator Bereuter, would you tell us what that bill is again?

SENATOR BEREUTER: It's LB 44.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I was asking the number, I meant the substance.

SENATOR BEREUTER: The substance is a very meritorious bill. Both Senator Koch and I came upon the idea and it would provide some assistance to legislative review of administrative rules and possibly set aside under certain conditions. It is pending on General File.
