

rules so I can explain the serious implications.

PRESIDENT: Now wait a minute. The rules have been suspended to prohibit debate.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I will do it again. I suspend the suspension.

PRESIDENT: Just reinstate the rules to allow it. You would have to reinstate the rules.

SENATOR DeCAMP: That sounds good, too.

PRESIDENT: But we can do that with the Speaker changing the order and then that will require a rule change. I don't think you can do this unless Senator Schmit's which was adopted by the full house to suspend the rules. It simply can't be done by one Senator withdrawing that. We have to take that up because the rules are suspended and there shall be no debate and no motions and no amendments.

SENATOR DeCAMP: That sounds like one of my own motions.

PRESIDENT: Now.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Then I would...this is a tricky one, isn't it. When you have suspended the rules, how you suspend the suspension and return the rules. I need counsel.

PRESIDENT: Move to reinstate the rules.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I move to reinstate the rules of the Nebraska Legislature.

PRESIDENT: I have got a whole lot of lights on here. Everybody knows what we are talking about. Yes, sir.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I want 532.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would like to make an inquiry. Will his motion to reconsider 532 take priority over mine because the bill didn't pass under any circumstance and it seems to me without a bill alive, how is his reconsideration motion (inaudible) with the emergency clause going to be considered?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have on my desk both Senator DeCamp's motion to reconsider the action and add the emergency clause and also Senator Chamber's action to reconsider our action on passage of LB 532 with the emergency clause stricken.

PRESIDENT: As I recall, Senator DeCamp's motion hit the desk first but I could be in error. That was my recollection. Was that yours, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: (Inaudible)

PRESIDENT: But I think the first motion would be the one we would take up and that is the one to reconsider LB 532 with the emergency clause attached. We would take that up first.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many votes would that take?

PRESIDENT: Reconsideration on a Final Passage. Reconsideration vote, I think, is 30.
