SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Question is the motion to override the Governors line-item veto of Section 44 of LB 549. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Bereuter. Record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 26 nays, 12 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion fails.

CLERK: That, Mr. President, is all the motions on that bill. Mr. President, your E & F Attorney reports that he did, on this day at 4:33, present to the Governor for his approval LB 273. Signed, Emory Burnett. Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk reports that, on this day, she, at 3:35, presented to the Governor LB 432. Signed, Barbara Jackson. Mr. President, there will be a communication inserted in the Journal delivering LB 4 with the certificate attached, that it has been passed notwithstanding the objection of the Governor, to the Secretary of State. There will be a legislative resolution inserted by Senator Marvel, LR 142, which will be read and laid over. Mr. President, a report of the Executive Board referring LB 128. Signed by members of the Executive Board. (Read Bereuter request, regarding LR 70, found on page 2304 of the Journal).

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any objection? Senator Bereuter's request is so ordered.

CLERK: Then, Mr. President, there is a communication from the Secretary of State acknowledging receipt of LB 4. Mr. President, that is all. Mr. President, there is a motion on the desk by Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Read the motion.

CLERK: Read Chambers motion found on page 2304 of the Journal.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I had talked to one of the parties involved. He is a lobbyist, and he asked that, in the interest of clearing anybody who may be under suspicion, a procedure be established whereby there could be a public taking of any comments and answers given as openly as the charge was made on the floor of the Legislature. So rather than have it debated on the floor of the Legislature, giving it to the Executive Board would let everybody and anybody who wants to comment on the issue go there, including people who could not speak on the floor of the Legislature because they're not members of the Legislature.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I've got a question of Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Chambers, will you respond?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BARNETT: What was the first remarks? You said you had a lobbyist bring you this?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Schimek.
