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is stupid and doesn't understand the bills. Poor dumb bunnies. You can't read these things except for the perfect one, except for the perfect one. So what we are doing, we are asking to allow Senators who are concerned about an issue to be able to put their name on a bill and put it into the Legislature and that is the basic idea of the whole legislative process and even we poor old dumb bunnies, even we poor old dumb bunnies, are allowed to participate in this system this way. So I urge you to introduce the bill which is all we are doing here and go ahead. Good grief!

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, now I didn't call you dumb bunnies, but since your leader said that, all it takes is one senator's name to introduce a bill. Now what he has said may indicate that his characterization of you is correct. The rules make it clear that only one senator has to sign a bill to introduce it. You don't need one leader and 38 tagalongs to introduce a bill, and if you thought that, I am here to undeceive you as to that factor, too, and maybe the reason I don't have more success in this body is that I start with the wrong presumption. I presume that you know and understand certain things, but if you don't, then I see why we don't communicate. Communication is talking to and with, not merely at, and if you don't understand that only one person can sign a bill and introduce it, then I have been talking at you and not to you. So in order to communicate, it takes only one signature to introduce a bill. So if that is what Senator DeCamp is concerned about, he has got 31 or more already, the bill can be introduced right now. So if he was laboring under the misconception that it takes 30 plus however many to introduce a bill, then I submit that his motion ought to be defeated because he is deceived, and through his unintentional, his unintentionally deceiving you, we have a situation which needs correction. So I move, I meant, I suggest that you defeat Senator DeCamp's motion. Let the bill be introduced with all of those who have been allowed to sign it thus far and go on with the business of the Legislature, and if he has too many signatures on it, based on what the Rules allow, let him redraft the bill and put his name on it and introduce it that way, the correct way. Of course, I guess if you have got 31 signatures and it only takes 30 to suspend the Rules, we don't like to acknowledge that we are wrong, so we would rather conceal our ignorance than correct it so you can probably get the same 30 to vote to suspend the Rules and cover the blunder that they have made. But my suggestion as the perfect one, and I will accept that characterization from Senator DeCamp, which I did not make of myself, the suggestion from the perfect one is that you defeat his motion and let this bill be introduced as any other bill would be introduced, because as he has often said and others, the rest of the state is watching. They will be aware of what you have done. They will be aware of its being a political year. So let the politics at least wait until the bill has been properly introduced.

PRESIDENT: Senator Jerome Warner.

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
