

PRESIDENT: We go to LB 258.

CLERK: Read LB 258.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Okay, Mr. President. There are actually two amendments. There is the committee amendment and then there are the other amendments in their composite or complimentary piece of merchandise and they in effect become the bill. So, I would move the adoption of the committee amendments and then I would at the very moment I am moving to adopt the committee amendments move to amend the committee amendments by adding the additional amendments. Is that okay?

PRESIDENT: Is this "a" or "b" expansion?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Pardon?

PRESIDENT: Is it capital as in money or capitol as in building?

SENATOR DE CAMP: As in money.

PRESIDENT: Okay, there is a misprint on the agenda. I don't know how we are going to expand this building.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Okay, so were you listening to what I said? The committee amendments I move to amend the committee amendments by adding the additional amendments.

PRESIDENT: Would you read that Mr. Clerk. Do you want the amendments read in full?

SENATOR DE CAMP: I don't think they need to be. I am passing out a copy of what they are. You can read them there. I am also passing out at this moment a detailed explanation of the various groups that support the bill, the significance of the bill, what it is so you can kind of look at it there, and then I can start explaining....

PRESIDENT: Does this meet with Senator Schmit's approval?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Oh, absolutely. Doesn't it?

PRESIDENT: Well all right, because ordinarily we let the introducer speak to the bill after the committee chairman. These are DeCamp amendments to the committee amendments? All right. Senator Mills, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I am very lost by our good chairman of the Banking Committee, what he is really doing and I would like to have you rule, Mr. Chairman, that the introducer, that is the chairman of the committee has introduced a committee amendment, and then you will note in the record that he is also amending the amendment for a practically a new bill.

PRESIDENT: Well the Chair can't rule that because the Chair doesn't have sufficient information for that. That might be...

SENATOR MILLS: Well we are lacking sufficient information.

PRESIDENT: Well, knowing your reputation for veracity I'm sure what you say is absolutely true, Senator. But, it is not my role to tell you what is true. Senator DeCamp,
