CLERK: Yes, Mr. President. New bills. (Read for the first time LB 744-51 by title found on pages 236 and 237 of the Journal). Mr. President, (Read LR 149). Mr. President, that matter should be laid over. Mr. President, (Read LR 151 (sic.) found on pages 239-241 of the Journal). That resolution should be properly laid over, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We're now taking up a motion by Senator Simon for unanimous consent to bracket the bill that we passed over earlier, LB 202. Senator Simon wants that bracketed. He asked for unanimous consent. Where is Senator Simon? To what date do you want unanimous consent to bracket LB 202? January 30. Alright. Is there an objection? Seeing none, that is so ordered and it's off the Preference bills. Senator Dworak asked unanimous...

SPEAKER LEUDTKE: (mike not activated). ...interrupt. With our hearing schedule, we'll still be in hearing, in all day hearing schedule, January 30 so you'd better make it after February 2.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simon, you'd better make that after February 2nd because we...alright, February 3rd? Alright, that's a nice date. February 3rd. Is there an objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered. Senator Dworak makes the same request of unanimous consent to bracket 177 to when? March 1? March 1. Is there an objection? Seeing none, that's ordered and that's off the list. Senator Maresh, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, when LB 411 was bracketed by Senator Mills for the 27th, which would be during the hearing period too, now that should be probably postponed till sometime in February too.


