CLERK: Took roll call vote found on page 327 of the Journal.

SENATOR MARVEL: Announce the vote.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 18 nays on the advancement, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: Call has already been raised. The bill is not advanced. We revert back to.... Senator Marsh, are you after the Clerk reads some things in, LB 75? Okay.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have two Attorney General's opinions. The first one is addressed to me, pursuant to an inquiry asked for by the Speaker and chairmen of the various committees with regard to travel compensation during the two week recess. That will be printed in the Journal in full. Mr. Chairman, I have an opinion addressed to Senator DeCamp on LB 532 of last session. That will be inserted in the Journal in full. Mr. President, your Committee on Agriculture and Environment, gives notice of a public hearing in Room 2230 for the week of January 20. Mr. President, your Committee on Banking, Commerce and Insurance gives notice of a public hearing in Room 2230 for the week of January 23. Mr. President, your Committee on Revenue gives notice of public hearings in Room 1019 for the week of January 23rd and January 31st. Mr. President, your Committee on Urban Affairs gives notice of public hearings in Room 2230 for the week of January 18th. Mr. President, I have a report from the Reference Committee submitting for reference LB 660 and LB 752 through 822. That will be inserted in the Journal. Mr. President, Senator Koch makes a motion to withdraw LB 735. That should properly be laid over until tomorrow. Mr. President, new bills. Read title to LB 824, 825, 826, 827 and 828. Mr. President, Senator Frank Lewis asks unanimous consent to bracket LB 99 until February 9th.

SENATOR SAVAGE PRESIDING

SENATOR SAVAGE: Any objections? So ordered. Chair recognizes Senator Shirley Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, the proposed amendments for LB 75 are to bring it into compliance with the Criminal Code. Is there anything you need to read?

CLERK: Senator, we should probably adopt the E & R amendments before we go on with yours.

SENATOR MARSH: Fine, go ahead then.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that we adopt the E & R amendments to LB 75.

SENATOR SAVAGE: All in favor say aye. Opposed same sign. Carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have amendments offered by Senator Marsh. It is a three page amendment. Would you like me to read those, Senator? It's your pleasure.

SENATOR MARSH: No. I think you really need the underlined sections. It's just clarification so that they'll come into compliance with the Criminal Code. They designate which misdemeanor they are. It simply is to bring it into compliance, instead of having it say something different. We want all sections of the law to be in order, together.
