

SENATOR SAVAGE: Is there any further question? Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Pass.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The question then is shall the amendments to LB 75 be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed by the same sign. Will you please vote? Please vote. Senator Savage voting aye. Record. Chair recognizes Senator Barry Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Never mind.

CLERK: Senator Savage voting aye. 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Who wants to take up the bill? Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I move it be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Any discussion? No discussion. The question is shall the bill be advanced to E & R. All those in favor vote aye. Opposed vote nay. LB 372.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are amendments pending on LB 372.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the E & R amendments to LB 372 be adopted.

SENATOR SAVAGE: All in favor say aye. Opposed vote nay. The amendments are carried.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment by Senator Barnett. I'm sorry, that's an amendment to an amendment. Mr. President, Senator Kelly offers the following amendment. Read Kelly amendment found on page 339 of the Journal.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Chair recognizes Senator Kelly. Excuse me, Senator Kelly. Senator Warner has his light on. For what purpose do you arise, Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: After you're done with, Mr. President, I have a procedural question.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Okay. Chair still recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, with the permission of the Speaker I move we adjourn.

SENATOR SAVAGE: We have some procedural business to get in, Senator Kelly. You still want recognition, Senator Warner? Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Just to this extent, I won't prolong it, Mr. President. I want to just state to the body that LB 374 I will in the morning make whatever appropriate motion. I did vote to advance that bill on the machine. I was in the room but I did not hear my name on the roll call vote. Something happened to the machine vote. So I was not recorded. I don't know what parliamentary problem that creates, but I'll figure out a way to straighten it out and offer a motion in the morning. I do not want to be on record as having not voted. I ended up that way. I did vote yes. Normally, if you vote on a machine vote, as I recall, and there is a roll call, it's done on the sheet. I assume, Pat.... Normally, I did not
