

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, we will lay it over then. The motion will just stand then. Yes, he is withdrawing his request to take up the withdrawal motion. So it will just stand on the agenda. At this time, the Chair would like to introduce some 36 senior high students from Raymond Central seated up here in the South balcony with Susan Kanelv, teacher. Would they stand and be recognized. South balcony. Welcome to your Legislature. Any further business on the desk, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp asked unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 757 in the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Are there any objections? If not, so ordered. We will proceed then with Select File only to the extent of those bills at this time that are on the agenda. The three bills that are shown on the agenda. We do have a considerable number of bills which have been advanced to Select File, placed on Select File, which if time permits, we may take those up that only have E & R amendments later in the day. But let's take up now the Select File agenda items beginning with LB 394.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is not substantive in any way. The attorney for the Department of Welfare is a little unsure of the words that are contained in the original bill after them having been written and rewritten for a year. Roy Mehmken has prepared this amendment to clarify for everybody concerned that the care we are talking about is the care in homes, not casual care by baby-sitters. We should adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: There is an amendment to the amendment on the desk, Senator Kelly. So we will take that up. Read the amendment.
