

CLERK: Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Koch. That will be inserted in the Legislative Journal in full. Mr. President, your Committee on Government gives notice of public hearing in Room 1113 for the week of January 26. Mr. President, your Committee on Public Works gives notice of hearing in Room East Chamber for the week of January 25 and February 1. Mr. President, the Nebraska Postsecondary Education Advisory Committee will meet today at 4:30 in Room 1003, signed Senator Warner. Mr. President, the Public Works Committee will meet for an executive session under the North Balcony immediately upon adjournment this afternoon, signed Senator Kremer. Otherwise it will be impossible to hold the hearings during the two weeks hearing schedule and just so it's understood, those bills that do not get set for hearing and get the reference report back by tomorrow when we adjourn cannot be heard during that two week period so that will just delay us that much more. So we plead with the Chairmen to do that.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, I'd like to remind the members of the Committee on Committees that we have placed the files on their desks which I wish they would bring to the Committee hearing this noon with them so that they don't have to go back and bring them.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move we recess until 1:30. Is that all right, John? You'll be through, won't you?

PRESIDENT: Is 1:30 all right, Senator Savage? You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. We're in recess until 1:30.
