

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: The question I have of you, Senator Labeledz, was did you wish it bracketed with the committee amendments on it, or off of it?

SENATOR LABEDZ: No, I'm sorry, I did not want that. I'm sorry.

SENATOR DUIS: You want my....

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes please.

SENATOR DUIS: You see your motion takes precedence over mine. So if you'd withhold that.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I withdraw mine for a few minutes.

SENATOR DUIS: Until we get a vote on this reconsideration.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready to vote on the matter of the reconsideration of committee amendments? You wish to speak to that motion, Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I do. Mr. Speaker, the bill that Bill Peters brought in to us, if you try to let the people understand what that's going to do, it's very complicated. The amendments that we put on are so that you can read them and understand them. They have eliminated a lot. What concern is it of the people across this state whether your love thy neighbor has to turn it in, whether you have to get the social security number of everybody playing bingo, whether you have to find out how many cards were sold, how many cards were sold as an entrance card, how many additional cards you got at 20 cents apiece. These are the things that we have removed from Bill Peter's amendments. The bill, as it is amended and is on the roll right now, is all right. I wanted to stay out of the pickle thing. I didn't want to get involved in that at all because that is a whole issue by itself. We have the amendments, we have a bill that can do that. I'm not going to try to do that right now on this bill. Leave the bill just like it is, with the committee amendments accepted. They are the ones that they voted in, and they are all right. Then let that bill stay on General File and get all the flack that it's going to draw. The people will know where it stands. If you take this off then you still have the same bill, same set of statutes. The bill will be very complicated and very hard to understand. I don't think anybody will understand. Could I ask Senator Duis a question on the time I have left? Senator Duis, would you answer a question? If you take the committee amendments off, what is the bill like then? I'm just doing what Jerry Koch does sometimes.

SENATOR DUIS: Senator Keyes, what I'm trying to tell you is this, I questioned you as to who brought you the bill and you said Bill Peters.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, that's right.

SENATOR DUIS: Then I said do you know who proposed the amendments. You said the committee. What I wanted to do here is to put this bill in Bill Peters' hands the way he brought it to you over here on General File. Senator Labeledz is then going
