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SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I think we're talking on the motion to bracket the bill. I do believe that I should have an opportunity to tell Senator Keyes I haven't done a thing with this bill. We're merely going to reconsider what you're going to do with it when this time comes. This time will come after the bill is unbracketed.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labedz, would you like to close debate on your motion to bracket?

SENATOR LABEDZ: No, I don't believe I have anything on the closing. I would suggest, though, that we will be working on it. I've all ready got three names that are going to help me on it. By February 13th, Senator Keyes, we may just go ahead and adopt all your committee amendments. I don't know for sure. But I would like to put this to the people that have been complaining to me over the last four years. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: She was closing, Senator Koch. The question then is shall this bill be bracketed until, when Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: February 13th.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to bracket the bill, Mr. President, till February 13th.

PRESIDENT: The bill is bracketed.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Maresh asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 406 in the Legislative Journal. Mr. President, new bills. Read title to LB 861, 862, 863 and 864.

PRESIDENT: LB 128.

CLERK: Read title to LB 128. The bill was first read on January 6th of last year. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee, Mr. President. The bill was advanced to General File with committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh, do you want to handle the committee amendments?

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, what the committee amendments do is strike Section 1. That has to do with putting the language back to where it is now. Those that are on pension funds, provided by the government, would be deducted from unemployment compensation. I move that Section 1 be stricken to place the legislation back to where it is now. I move that the committee amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I hope that you will listen to the debate before automatically accepting the committee amendments. I don't know how many of you are aware that, when the bill that Senator Dworak and I introduced and was subsequently passed a couple of years ago, Senator Kelly made a motion, at that time, deleting the veterans in the State of Nebraska from being eligible for unemployment compensation benefits.
