CLERK: 10 ayes, 21 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a unanimous consent request from Senator Lewis to print in the Legislative Journal a newsclip from the Omaha World-Herald dated Saturday, December 3, 1977.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Is there an objection? There is no objection so it is so ordered. It is printed in the Journal. There is nothing to speak to. It is printed in the Journal. There was a request for unanimous consent and it was granted and it is in the Journal. There was no objection. You made a request for unanimous consent and it is in the Journal. Now there is nothing to speak to, Senator Lewis. All right. Turn Senator Lewis' on. Would you state to the Chair your point of personal privilege.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes, Mr. President, during my absence yesterday, there was a letter printed from the Chief Executive in regard to the activity which involved me on the floor of the Legislature last Friday and I would like to make some clarifying remarks on that.

PRESIDENT: That doesn't qualify as a point of personal privilege. It doesn't impugn your honesty and your integrity so I am denying your point of personal privilege.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, the record speaks for itself and that issue will be out to each and every one to read and, of course....

PRESIDENT: I am denying your point of personal privilege.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I appreciate that but the press has a copy and every member does and it is going in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. We go now to Select File.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion.

PRESIDENT: All right, there is another change in the Speaker's order. A motion to bracket LB 406.

CLERK: Until March 4, 1978, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Whose motion is that?

CLERK: That is offered by Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: It should be February instead of March. I am sorry.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to change that to a request for unanimous consent?

SENATOR MARVEL: I would like to ask unanimous consent that we hold up 406 in its present position until the hearings are over which would be, what, February 3rd, February 4th.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? There is an objection.
