LB 109, 915, 916

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I would like to ask at this time if there are any members of the Legislature that have any new bills to introduce. If you've got your bills to introduce, we would urge you, plead with you to get them in. You do have until the time of adjournment today. However, if you have them in your possession, you know you're going to introduce them, get them in so we can get them referred. Senator Marvel is ready to try to get the reference done. Please get them in. Are there any that are not going to be able to get them in today, you'll just have to wait till we come back in February.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills. Read title to LB 915 and 916. Mr. President, your Committee on Constitutional Revision and Recreation gives notice of public hearing in the Supreme Court Hearing Room for the week of January 26th and February 2nd. Mr. President, your Committee on Government gives notice of hearing in Room 1113 for the week of January 26th. Mr. President, LR 157 is ready for your signature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session, capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LR 157. Senator Cullan, would you want to move 109A? Wait. I better ask Senator.... Senator Warner. We still have 109A. You did object to moving 109 without a record. They don't need it? Well, but it's here. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 109A.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, doesn't our rules call for the A bill to follow? I doubt if you could entertain a motion of bracketing.

PRESIDENT: Well we've done it. It's bracketed there.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you. That's fine.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Yes.

CLERK: Read R. Lewis motion found on page 413 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I didn't realize, until the Clerk called it to my attention, that we had this rule. This is legislation involving proposed legislation, involving the rights of eminent domain. We had a special committee, of five members this summer, who held hearings on this particular subject. These are the recommendations of the committee, submitted in this proposed legislation. The committee members would all like to sign it, but it is not a standing committee. It was a select committee. For that reason I'm asking for suspension of the rules and introduction of this bill.
