

SENATOR MARVEL: You're making a motion to adopt the amendment?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Right.

SENATOR MARVEL: Okay. You've heard the motion. Is there a second to the motion? The motion is to adopt the Savage amendments to LB 21. Okay. Senator Murphy's amendments as proposed by Senator Savage. Any other discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Voting aye, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Marvel voting aye.

SENATOR MARVEL: We are voting on the Murphy amendments to LB 21. We're voting on the Murphy amendments to LB 21. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the Murphy amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendments are adopted. Senator Savage, you want to move the advancement.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Move it to E & E for engrossing.

SENATOR MARVEL: Is there a second to the motion? All those in favor say aye. Oppose no. Motion carried. Bill is advanced.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE PRESIDING

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 109.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Barnett's made the motion to return. We now have, before the body, an amendment offered by Senator Barnett.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Chair recognizes Senator Barnett on LB 109, on the return.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd move for the adoption of the amendment that I have brought this back for. It's a specific amendment so that in the event that any of you wish to do anything else with the bill you can do it some other time. This specific amendment clarifies the problem and the questions. When the amendment was drafted, that was accepted by this body, somebody felt it was not clear that 20 percent of this money, the new tax, would go into the Game and Parks Fund. It was intended that way when I offered the amendment. It had to be cleared up by this specific amendment to allow the money from the cigars, smoking tobacco and chewing tobacco, it has to have this amendment to allow the 20 percent to go to the Game Commission. I've talked to Senator Mills about this. I've also talked to Senator Labedz and Senator Gene Reutzel. It's all been...it's been accepted by everybody. With that, I'd hope that this body would accept the amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any further discussion? Chair recognizes Senator Fitzgerald.

SENATOR FITZGERALD: Would you please explain to Senator Barnett that Mr. Reutzel's name is Barry, not Gene.
