

to this piece of legislation now. There really should not be any cause of alarm or problems about the amendment. I have talked to the people at the Motor Vehicles Department. They assured me that there is no problem, even in implementation on this. It will not cause them any severe problems. It will be a source of revenue to the state. In addition, it can be very clearly indicated and marked that this is for identification purposes only. It cannot, in any way, be passed off as a valid drivers license. It would have the same information that is on the drivers license--name, identification, the social security number, the birth date, all those things, the height, weight and age. As long as you keep the amendment pure, Senator Maresh, and don't fool around with the ten years, there will be no problem in implementing it. There will be no problem in using it for the purpose that it was intended. So, Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, I would urge for the amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Question before the House is the adoption of the Simon amendment to LB 574. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Question before the House is the adoption of the Simon amendment to LB 574. Record the vote. Senator Simon.

SENATOR SIMON: I would ask for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Question is Call of the House. Have you all voted on that? Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: House is under Call. Sergeant at Arms will bring in all the legislators. All legislators will return to their desks. All nonsenatorial personnel will leave the floor of the Legislature. Every legislator will please record his or her presence. For those of you who are returning, we are voting on the Simon amendment to LB 574. I think we'll receive call in votes at this time.

CLERK: Senator Cope voting aye.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Fitzgerald voting aye. Senator Richard Lewis voting aye. Senator Jack Mills voting aye. Senator Koch voting aye. Senator Keyes voting aye. Senator Labeledz voting aye. Senator Savage voting aye. Senator Maxey voting aye. Senator Barnett voting nay.

CLERK: Senator Maresh changing from nay to aye.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Simon. Senator Simon moves that the Call be raised. All those in favor of raising the Call vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 1 nay to raise the Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Call is raised. Report the vote on the original amendment.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Simon amendment is adopted. What do you wish to do with the bill, Senator Simon?
