

SENATOR KEYES: I just have one question for Senator Marvel or Senator Maxey.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Marvel or Senator Maxey, which one of you wants to respond?

SENATOR KEYES: How will this affect prefab homes that are brought in and set up? Will the charge still be on prefab homes that are set up on a foundation? Will that be subject to sales tax...property tax or not, including the valuation?

SENATOR MARVEL: The amendment has to do, strictly, with service charges which are, at the moment, excluded from sales, use taxes. This is not new language or additional language. This is just clarification. Senator Keyes, as I understand your question we're talking about charges associated with the sale of a cabin trailer motor vehicle. Do you have a copy of the amendment?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes. That just deals with cabin trailers motor vehicles?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

SENATOR KEYES: It doesn't have to do with a mobile home or a home that you can set on a foundation?

SENATOR MARVEL: No. It strictly has to do with service charges which, I understand, are, at the moment, excluded from the sales and use tax. This is simply a clarification. This is not a new addition. I don't know whether that answers Senator Burrows questions or not, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, I would like to rise in support of the Maxey amendment, but to say that Senator Burrow's argument really doesn't hold water. The reason is twofold. The very fact that the mobile home isn't the same value as a frame home either, so they shouldn't be paying the same tax. Plus the fact that adding or setting up this trailer, delivering it, that sort of thing, it doesn't add a nickels worth of value to the trailer. Consequently, it should not be taxed as part of the value of the trailer. For that reason I don't think that Senator Burrow's argument really holds water. I would support Senator Maxey. Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I move the previous question.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Do I see five hands? I do. The question is shall debate cease. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Question is shall debate cease on the Marvel-Maxey amendment number three. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Question is shall debate cease. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 7 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Debate ceases. Senator Maxey, if you care to close on your amendment.
