

rest of you may submit to being treated like children, but I will not. If that is the way the Speaker is going to do, and he has an interest in expediting his agenda, I would respectfully suggest that the Speaker not preside in these types of situations because his objectivity is somewhat questionable.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We'll let the body decide. That's my only answer. The matter is that if certain people would stay on the floor when we are voting we wouldn't have to have Calls of the House. Those people know who they are. There are two or three, in particular, that I make reference to. Is there any further discussion on the overruling of the Chair? Senator Keyes, did you wish to speak? Hold up your hand if you want to speak on the overruling of the Chair. I'm going to call the question if I don't see anybody else. All those in favor of overruling the Chair vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion fails. The Chair has been sustained. We will continue with the debate on the motion of Senator DeCamp. I'm only going to recognize, under that position those who want to speak to that motion. Hold up your hand if you want to speak to that motion. The motion is the introduction of a bill. You have the matter on your desks. You have the statement of intent. We need to suspend the rules to introduce a bill. Is there any further discussion on that motion? All right. Question is all those in favor of suspending the rules to introduce the bill, suggested by the Banking and Insurance Committee, vote aye, opposed nay. It requires 30 votes. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Read the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bill. Read title to LB 940.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Chair recognizes Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: Mr. President, this is on Legislative Bill 660. For those of you who are interested, on page 568, amendment number three was introduced. There are some problems connected with this. We don't have time to work them out. So I make a motion that 660 be returned to Select File for the specific amendment. The specific amendment is to strike the third amendment, which is on page 568. I make a motion that the bill be returned for that specific amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Savage, did you wish to address yourself to the motion?

SENATOR SAVAGE: I have a bill that I want to...that the Transportation Advisory Committee wants to introduce under the suspension of the rules.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Do you have the statement of intent on the desks?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Yes.
