So would you take those lists that I circulated yesterday. We will have additional bills. They are not all inclusive. We do not have all the bills on the lists that you got yesterday. You'll get another list today. We will also supply you with a form so that any committee chairmen, introducer of the bill, or any three of you may sign a form to take those bills off of consent calendar for tomorrow afternoon. Otherwise we will proceed with that list in the order in which they are on the list. The other thing I want to mention is that Appropriations Committee Chairman Warner reports that we will be ready to take up appropriations bills the 12th of March, which is right on schedule. In discussing it with the chairmen this morning it was decided that because of the monotony of taking them up all day, we will start that first week, see how it goes, by taking up appropriations bills in the morning only, then proceeding with our other business in the afternoon. So that gives you kind of a schedule for the next few weeks ahead. Are there any questions? Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Question of the Chair. You mentioned you were going to take a poll in an attempt to decide if we stay on Friday's. My question is, is this going to be debatable? Before you answer the question I would like to say I hope not because I think all of us have our mind made up. We'll debate it for half a day, if we do, and we'll lose that time.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Thank you very much, Senator Kremer. This is why we decided on a poll rather than a discussion because we'd waste a half a day talking about it. Very few of us would change our minds.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you for allowing me to answer the question for you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Thank you. Any other questions? We will then proceed with the next item on the agenda on motions, for one hour only. I want to also indicate that on the agenda Select File should have stated one hour only. That was left off, it should have been on there, one hour only for Select File. So motions then. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR MARVEL PRESIDING

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Schmit, are you ready on your motion on 834? If so, Clerk will read the motion.

CLERK: Read Schmit motion on LB 834 found on page 702 of the Journal.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I take this action because the committee has indefinitely postponed LB 834. I feel the bill has merit. It has been some time since the bill has been discussed by this body. I believe that it deserves the treatment of the entire body. There has been a considerable amount of speculation about this bill. For those of you who are not familiar with it I'd ask you to look at your bill book and refresh your memory. The bill basically limits the number of liquor licenses per county to one per 1200 population. The bill is not dissimilar to ordinances that are presently in effect in the City of Lincoln and Omaha.
