

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Is there any further discussion on the matter of the return? All those in favor of the return, requesting the Governor to return LB 244 vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on Senator Hasebroock's request to bring back his 244 from the Governor's office in order to return it to Select File for specific amendment to correct an error. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on Senator Hasebroock's motion, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion is adopted and now we have to have a letter requesting the return and then we can act on it, is that right? Then that is all we can do at this particular point and get the letter over, and as soon as we have it back, Senator Hasebroock, we can take some action on it. Is Senator Warner present? We will also take up the Warner, Senator Warner, are you ready? Do you want to read the motion, Mr. Clerk? All right, we have a series of these kinds of motions. We had better take care of them this morning before we get on consent calendar this afternoon. Mr. Clerk, read the first motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner moves to introduce Request #1467 by the Appropriations Committee.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I think the Pages have passed out the intent of the bill. Request #1467 constitutes a legislation that the Appropriations Committee will hold a hearing on Monday noon on February 27th and it deals with review of a possible pay plan and procedure for employees of state government. If we could have it introduced today, it would be printed and be available.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any further discussion on the introduction of the bill? All right. It requires 30 votes to introduce the bill. It is a request of Senator Warner. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Let's get as many people in here as we can or we will probably have to have a Call of the House. It requires 30 votes. Senator DeCamp, are you going to vote on this. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to introduce a bill.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The bill is introduced.

CLERK: Mr. President, a new bill, LB 946. Title read. Mr. President, Senator Warner now moves to suspend Rule 3, section 5 and set the hearing for LB 946 for Monday, February 27, 1978 at 12 o'clock.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: This is a motion to suspend the rules for the purpose of notice of this committee hearing. Any further discussion? Senator Warner, any further. It requires 30 votes to suspend the rules for the purpose of such notice. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. For all of you who were not in here, I mentioned that we have a series of these particular type motions which we ought to get taken care of this morning so I would plead with you not to go too far away so that we can at least have our 30 people here to get these routine motions out of the way before we recess for lunch. Have you all voted on the Warner motion to
