

CLERK: 29 ayes, 3 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Call is raised. Now we'll proceed with LB 574.

CLERK: Senator Maresh, 574. Read Maresh motion on LB 574 found on page 344 of the Journal.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: This was added to the agenda as a motion. We're going to take the motions that we have. Chair recognizes Senator Maresh for explanation.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, 574 had some amendments attached to it that required an A bill. As we know this morning we heard that all A bills have to be held up. So this will hold up LB 574 for about a month. This bill was brought to the Legislature without a public hearing. It had an emergency clause attached to it. It was expedited. Now it's held up for this A bill. I feel that if we can bring this back to Select File we can strike the Lamb and the Simon amendments and get a clean bill passed. I move that we return this bill to Select File for the specific amendment to strike the two amendments. There is another bill, LB 587...no 378, that could be used for that purpose, to place the Simon and Lamb amendments to this bill and still pass it this year if they wish to do so. This bill of mine, to start with, was something that needed to be done early in the session. It allows a temporary permit to be issued to people that are not in the state to have their photograph taken. They are probably out of the state or out of the country. By passing this bill it will allow these people to send for this temporary permit for a cost of \$2. So I feel that it's very important to get this bill passed because there are those that are waiting to have this bill passed to get this special permit without the drivers license photograph. I move that we return this bill to Select File.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Maresh, we're only going to have about three minutes left on our half hour rule. We've got many lights. I don't think we're going to.... Would you mind if we just put it over until the next time we take up motions, rather than to do it all over again when we start out? Because we're just going to have to start all over again anyway. Is that agreeable? We'll call this a pending item on motions and take it up the next time we get to motions. Time has run on this. So I think we'll call time. Anything else you want to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. We'll proceed then with General File. LB 407. Senator Labeledz, we're back with....

CLERK: Read title to LB 407. Mr. President, when the body last considered the bill we had adopted...we had failed to adopt the committee amendments. An amendment offered by Senator Labeledz was adopted. Amendments offered by Senator Maxey and two by Senator Carsten were adopted. I now have before the body, Mr. President, a motion offered by Senator Fowler. The amendment can be found on page 753 of the Legislative Journal.
