PRESIDENT: I have no idea. Report the vote.

SENATOR KELLY: Just a minute, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: He is going to report the vote, Senator Kelly.
Sir. Yes.

SENATOR DE CAMP: We are on Final Reading, correct?

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, how many people are excused?

CLERK: Three excused, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there any Senators who have not voted that
want to vote?

CLERK: Senator DeCamp votes aye. Senator Lamb votes aye.
Senator Newell votes no. Senator Kahle voting aye. Senator
Heiner voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Any other votes?

CLERK: Senator Chambers voting no.

PRESIDENT: We have had the roll call. Any further votes?
Report the vote. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I was wondering. Has the vote been taken on
this?

PRESIDENT: We have had a roll call.

SENATOR LAMB: Has the Sergeant at Arms located all the
people that are in the building that have not...?

PRESIDENT: We are under Call. All Senators are required
to be here.

SENATOR LAMB: Point of order, Mr. Chairman. When we have
roll call or Call of the House, the Sergeant at Arms collects
those people. I'm wondering if the Sergeant at Arms has done
that in this situation.

PRESIDENT: No.

SENATOR LAMB: What is the procedure to have that...?

PRESIDENT: There is none.
