LB 233, 380, 380 A, 385,  
441, 501, 660

CLERK: Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk respectfully reports that she has on this day at 11:12 a.m. presented the Governor for his approval the following legislative bill, 660. Mr. President, Senator Dick Lewis asks to be excused on Friday afternoon, February 24. Mr. President, a communication from the Governor. (Read message from the Governor found on page 883 of the Journal regarding LB 233, 380, 380 A, and 441.) Mr. President, a communication from the Governor. (Read communication from Governor found on pages 883 and 884 of the Journal.) That will be referred to the Committee on Committees. Mr. President, your Committee on Committees gives notice of public hearing for March 2nd and March 7th. Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined LB 501 and find the same correctly enrolled.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: While the Legislature is in session and capable of doing business I propose to sign and I do sign LB 501. All right, Mr. Clerk. Are there any other matters to be read in?

CLERK: I have nothing further at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We will then proceed to the second item, Special Order, item b under item seven which the Speaker would like to announce his placing on the agenda for General File, the bills which were left over from Committee priorities from last year which for the last three or four weeks we have been trying to get on the agenda. We had promised that we would take individual and Committee priority bills. We have taken care of all the individual priority bills early. We are now taking the only two left that the Speaker knows of, LB 385 and LB 476. We will proceed then, Mr. Clerk, with LB 385.

CLERK: Mr. President, (Read title to LB 385). The bill was originally read on January 21, 1977. It was referred to the Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are no amendments pending.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, may I just kind of think out loud with you and ask a question. We have only got thirty minutes before lunch. I notice you have thirty minutes assigned for motions. If you wanted to do that I would be acceptable and I have got a special reason and I will tell you what it is. LB 476, which is the next one out of the box right after this one, I'm supposed to be handling for Senator George because he is not here and I've got to get myself briefed a little on that. Would there be any objection to just taking up the motions which you have got thirty minutes assigned for and we have got just thirty minutes and we can do the others, have a straight hour for what you have got assigned on the other one?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The only thing I will say is that we have got a couple of the persons that wanted motions that were not going to be back until this afternoon, Senator Maresh, Senator Keyes, I know...

SENATOR DE CAMP: Also I have got a few votes missing, votes missing on my bill. Do you have any objection, Mr. Speaker? I mean, you have got the half hour and that is what you have assigned.

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
