

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 893, Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Chambers, the Chair ruled that that failed. It is the Chair's position that this takes 25 votes. All right. I just wanted you to understand so that you have a chance to appeal. Senator Hefner moves that the Call be raised. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 4 nays to raise the Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. We go to LR 476.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 406 was a bill introduced by the.....

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker, the Chairman of the Urban Affairs Committee is not here, the only man absent.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We will put it over until next week.

PRESIDENT: Where do you go from here now on your agenda?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Then we will go down to, we are ready for General File.

PRESIDENT: General File. We go to LB 92. Senator Goodrich.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 92 was a bill introduced by Senator Glenn Goodrich. Title read. The bill was referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee. The committee indefinitely postponed the bill. Senator Goodrich made a motion to place it on General File. That was adopted on February 9, 1977. A motion offered by Senator Goodrich yesterday was adopted by the body. And a motion offered by Senator Koch was adopted. I now have pending, Mr. President, a motion offered by Senator Warner. The amendment reads as follows: Read amendment found on page 864 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: It is Senator Warner's motion. He is wanting to present his motion.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, unfortunately, I am going to have to withdraw the amendment, not on lack of merit but because it needs to be reworded better than I did and I will offer it on Select File. So I will ask unanimous consent to withdraw.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Goodrich or Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Frank Lewis offers the following amendment: Read. (See page 894, Legislative Journal.)
